DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

FOR FAMILY, FRIENDS & GROUPS

1. Who is the person at work who makes you feel most valued? What do they do that makes you feel that way?
2. What does it mean to be made in the image of God? Why is it important to see others as made in God's image, and how does this make a difference in how we treat them?
3. How does your work empower others to do what they are called to do ("to rule over" [Genesis 1:26], the part of God's world they are entrusted with)? How could you empower others more?
4. What are things that you do that might be robbing the people you work with from rest (Genesis 2:2-3)? What could you do to make sure they are able to get genuine rest?
5. How does the specific work you do (not merely the money you get paid for it) provide for the needs of others? How would keeping aware of this motivate you in your work?
6. How can you help people stop and appreciate their work, to pause and see that "it is very good" (Genesis 1:31)?
7. What can you do this week to make sure the people at your work feel valued?
8. What can you do to make sure you enter each day of work aware of God's image in the people you will encounter?
9. How does knowing what Jesus did for you free you to serve, empower, and honor the people at your work?

PRAYER PROMPT: Praise and Honor: As you think about the image of God, what does it look like to praise God for all the attributes we share, as well as those that are unique to God? Using the attributes of God you discussed today (or those found in the attributes of God link at ccclife.org/prayer), spend time praying those words back to God, praising who God is and honoring God's character.
