## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY, FRIENDS & GROUPS

ICEBREAKER: What is something you've experienced that was hyped up, but did not deliver on the hype?

- 1. Why is it important to pay attention to our questions when reading the Bible? What do you do when you have questions you can't answer about a passage in the Bible?
- 2. Read Mark 11:11-25 out loud. Give everyone a couple of minutes in silence to make their own observations about the passage (especially themes, repeating words/ideas, truths about God, and striking details). Go around the group and share things you observed.
- 3. Why did Jesus curse the fig tree (11:12-14)? How is this more than just Jesus getting hangry?
- 4. How does this event serve as a "living parable"?
- 5. Why did Jesus disrupt the temple? What was going on that he objected to (11:15-18)?
- 6. What gives Jesus the right to judge us and our lives?
- 7. Why does it matter to Jesus that we bear fruit?
- 8. After judging the temple, why does Jesus start talking about prayer (11:22-24)?
- 9. How can it be true that "whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours" (11:24)? How does that fit with your experience?
- 10. What other stories or passages in the Bible put Jesus' huge claims about prayer (11:22-24) into a bigger context?
- 11. If God did everything you were asking him right now, what would be different in your life and the world?
- 12. What is the connection between forgiving others and receiving forgiveness (11:25)? PRAYER PROMPT: What are some bold prayers you need to pray, believing that God can do what you ask? Share those needs and pray for each other with confidence.
