ICEBREAKER: What's something you believed as a kid that makes you laugh now? 1) If someone who was not very familiar with the Bible asked you, "Why did God want sacrifices?" how would you explain it to them?

FOR FAMILY, FRIENDS & GROUPS

2) According to Clayton's sermon, what did the sacrifices communicate?

3) Read Hebrews 10:1-25 out loud. Give everyone in the group 3-5 minutes to read it again silently and mark up their observations (truths about God, repeated words/ideas, themes, striking details, connections to other parts of the Bible, questions you have, etc.). Then, go around the group and have people share one of their observations and discuss it.

4) In Hebrews 10:1-4, what are the limits of sacrifice the author identifies? Why were the Old Testament sacrifices not enough?

5) Even though we do not offer sacrifices, what are some of the insufficient ways we try to do things to handle our guilt? (Clayton gave examples in the sermon. Perhaps you can think of others.) 6) In Hebrews 10:5-10, there are two key details about Jesus: 1) he had a body, and 2) he did God's will. Why are these things important? How do they make it so Jesus can offer the final sacrifice? 7) In Hebrews 10:11-14, it says that the priests stand and Jesus sat down. Why does this matter? 8) In Hebrews 10:14, it says that those who are in Christ have been "made perfect" but are also "being made holy." Explain the tension between these two ideas. How does that play out in our lives?

9) What can you do this week to "draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance" (Hebrews 10:22)?

10) If Jesus has done everything we need, why is it important to "not giving up meeting together" (Hebrews 10:25)?

11) What can we do as a group to regularly "spur one another on toward love and good deeds" (Hebrews 10:24)?
