DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

FOR FAMILY, FRIENDS & GROUPS

- 1) If you have time, watch the Bible Project's overview video of Hebrews (8 mins). As you watch, jot down 2-3 themes you are going to look for as we read and study the book in this series.
- 2) Read Hebrews 1:1-4 out loud. Take a few minutes in silence for everyone to mark up the passage and write down observations about the passage. Look for repeated words/ideas, truths about God, themes, and striking details. Jot down any questions the passage raises. After a few minutes, have each person share at least one observation or question and discuss it.
- 3) Based on this verse and Clayton's sermon, how does Jesus relate to the Old Testament? What does that mean about how we study the Old Testament?
- 4) What does it mean that Jesus is "heir of all things" (Hebrews 1:2)?
- 5) If Jesus is the "through whom [God] made the universe" (Hebrews 1:2) who is "sustaining all things with his powerful word" (Hebrews 1:3), how should that change how you pray?
- 6) What does it mean that Jesus is "the radiance of God's glory" (Hebrews 1:3)?
- 7) The Bible says that Jesus is not merely a representative of God, but he is "the exact representation of his being" (Hebrews 1:3). How does that change how we respond to him? Why does that rule out simply thinking of him as a good teacher or being neutral about him?
- 8) What are the implications of the fact that Jesus "provided purification for sins" (Hebrews 1:3)?
- 9) If a stranger observed your life for a month, what would they say was first in your heart?
- 10) What makes it hard to make Jesus superior to everything else in your life?
- 11) What steps can you take to move Jesus into the first place in your life?

PRAYER: Spend time praising Jesus in prayer. Have each person pick a different title or description of Jesus in Hebrews 1:1-4 and have them expand on it in prayer, praising Jesus for who he is.
