Date & Time

Cost

The cost for the retreat is \$210 and includes transportation to and from Expeditions Unlimited. Dinner on Friday at CCC before they leave. On Saturday, breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Sunday breakfast and lunch.

- Paintball for \$20 and High Ropes for \$15 are additional costs and not included in the registration fee. It is not required to participate in these activities, and we have other activities available for students.

Transportation

Transportation will be provided by coach buses for all campuses and will be leaving from the St. Charles/South Elgin Campus.

Lodging

Each Student will have a bed and will stay in preassigned gender-specific cabins at Expeditions Unlimited. There will be at least two leaders in each cabin. A sleeping bag and pillow are recommended to lie on top of the beds.

What will my student be doing during the retreat?

Throughout the weekend, students will have time to participate in large group sessions that will consist of worship and teaching. Small group discussions and activities with leaders and plenty of time to have fun participating in various activities around the camp, like bonfires and S'mores. Expeditions Unlimited has a canteen store called Higher Ground for kids to grab snacks and souvenirs.

- Towel
