DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY, FRIENDS & GROUPS

ICEBREAKER: Have you ever borrowed something from a neighbor? How did your neighbor react to the request?

1. Read 2 Kings 4:1-7. What do you observe? What stands out to you? Do you have any clarifying questions?

2. (The Widow's Need) Is it easy or difficult for you to ask for help when you are in a time of need? OR What would make it easier and/or more difficult for you to ask for help when you are in a time of need?

3. (The Prophet's Questions) How do you respond when faced with someone in need?

4. (The Prophet's Questions) What do you have (skill, resource, connection, ability, etc.) that could be of help to someone else in a time of need?

5. (The Prophet's Questions) How does Elisha asking the widow, "What do you have?" bring dignity back to the widow?

6. (The Prophet's Questions) What holds you back from engaging with someone who is in need?

7. (God's Provision) What other miracles in the Bible could you think of that could give you faith to believe in God's provision?

APPLICATION QUESTIONS:

1. Ask your group if anyone has a need in their life right now. Then put into practice the two questions in the sermon: How can I help you? What do you have?

2. Is there someone in your life that you could be an "empty jar" for? Someone you could show up for, open your schedule to, and let God fill the space.
